





Grand Prix Lady Katina Paxinou









Katina Paxinou was born on December 17, 1900 in Piraeus, Athens. Her birth name was Ekaterini Konstantopoulou. She was the daughter of the prosperous flour mill owner Vassilis Konstantopoulos and Eleni Malandrinou. She studied music and song at the Geneva Conservatory, and also at schools in Berlin and Vienna. She married the industrialist Giannis Paxinos, with whom she had two daughters.








Her first professional appearance was in the Municipal Theatre of Piraeus, in the opera 'Sister Beatrice' by the prominent composer Dimitris Mitropoulos (1920). Four years later she made her debut in a dramatic role in 'La Femme nue'.

In the early 1930's she was one of the founding members of the National Theatre of Greece.

The outbreak of the Second World War found her in UK; she later managed to arrive at the US, where she appeared on Broadway, starring in productions of Ibsen's 'Edda Gabbler' and 'Sophie' by R. Feld and G. Ross.

At the age of 42, she was offered her first film role in the film 'For Whom the Bell Tolls' (1943), a Paramount Pictures production, based on Ernest Hemingway's novel.

She played the role of the Spanish guerrilla Pillar, along with famous actors like Gary Cooper and Ingrid Bergman.









For her performance as Pilar she won the Academy Award for Best Supporting Actress at the 1944 Oscar Awards. For that same role, she also received the Award for *Best Supporting Actress* at the first ever Golden Globes, and a *Best Actress* Award by the National Board of Review (1943).



She appeared in a few more Hollywood films, like Confidential Agent (1945), Mourning Becomes Electra (1947), Rocco and his Brothers by Luchino Visconti (1960).







In 1950, Katina Paxinou returned to Greece and resumed her theatre career by reviving the classical Greek tragedies. She also made tours in the USA and Europe, performing in plays like Lorca's *The House of Bernarda Alba* and Sophocles' *Oedipus Tyrannus*. She also appeared in British and American television plays.











In 1968, after the establishment of the Military Junta in Greece, Paxinou and Minotis formed their own theatre group which performed in Thessaloniki and Athens. They were generally considered the great couple of Greek theatre. Paxinou's last great success was Bertold Brecht's *Mother Courage* and Her Children (1971 – 1972).











Distinctions

In her lifetime, Katina Paxinou was awarded the 'Grand Commander of the Royal Order of George I', and several other honors and prizes. She is also the only non-Diaspora Greek actor to have been honored with her own star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame (1960).

She passed away on 22 February 1973 in Athens, at the age of 72.


- * "We have to fill our soul with the sun, and give this sun to other people as well"
